historical significance:

The Maud Williamson landmark is located in Maud Williamson State Park near Wheatland, Oregon. The monument is a bronze plaque mounted on a vertical slab of sandstone. It reads:

"Williamson State Park The timbered area given to the State of Oregon by Maud Williamson as a memorial to her mother Ruby T. Williamson, January, 1934."

Maud Williamson was a daughter of Charles S. and Ruby (Johnson) Williamson. Her father was burn in Huntingtonshire, England, August 23, 1838, and emigrated to the United States in 1852. In 1876 Williamson moved from Kansas to Oregon and settled near Wheatland. He was a druggist and postmaster in Wheatland and later a farmer. Williamson married in Kansas on April 10, 1867, to Ruby Johnson, the daughter of Albert and Anna (Sauter) Johnson.

The landmark stands in the fir grove and is about 150 yards north of the Williamson house.
