Physical assertperon or property and statement or historical significance:

The Wingville Grange is a "T"-shape, wood frame building with a gable roof. The structure is the result of the combination of two early buildings in Wingville. The front portion was once the Wingville I.O.O.F. Lodge. The rear (or north) section was the Methodist Episcopal Church of Wingville.

The front section has two-over-two, double hung sash windows; the rear section has six-over-six, double hung sash windows. The exterior of the building is now shakes. The building is in good condition. It is presently a grange hall.

Wingville was settled in the 1860's. As a town it was eclipsed by nearby Baker, Oregon.
