ommencing at the quarter section corner on the South side of Section 33, T. 2 S., R. 7 E.,

of the W.M., in rhe County of Clackamas and State of Oregon; thence North on the center

line of said section 33, 1980.00 feet to a stake; thence West 660.0 feet to a stake at the

Southeast corner and initial point of the tract of land hereby described; thence North

330 feet to a point; thence West 330 feet to a point; thence South 330 feet to a stake;

thence East 330 feet to the point of beginning at the initial point.

The Historic Church of St. John The Evangelist was originally built to serve the needs of Mt. Hood area residents, tourists, vacationers, and skiers from all over the State of Oregon and visitors from other states. Dedicated on September 26, 1937, the current building replaced the original St. Johns' which collapsed under snow weight on February 16, 1937. The structure is rustic style, constructed of peeled logs, and designed and built by Henry Steiner, a prominent area craftsman. It is one of the last log structures in the entire area to retain its' original design integrity with no basic alterations. Currently it is being used as a private residence.
