SETTING: Facing south on the northwest corner of First and Oak streets in commercial area. Building flush with the public right of way; wide sidewalk; parking lot to the north.

The annex to the Mount Hood Hotel was constructed in 1910 by C.A. Bell. Bell came to Hood river in 1890. In 1910 bought the land on the northwest corner of First and Oak streets for the purpose of building the hotel. The original Mount Hood Hotel was built in conjunction with the arrival of the railroad around 1882 and was located directly south of the hotel annex building. The hotel and annex buildings catered to tourist travelling on the Columbia River Highway. The hotel prided themselves as being "up to date and equipped with every convenience for the comfort of the guest." C. A. Bell was the owner and manager of the hotels for a number of years. At the east end of the annex building was the hotel lobby and dining room. A stage was located in the rear. According to the 1916 Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps other businesses were located in building on the first floor. An automobile supply store, a grocery store, William Webers Harness and Saddle Store, and Testevin's and Sonniksen Billards and Cigar shop occupied the store fronts of the Annex building. The hotel rooms were located on the second floor.

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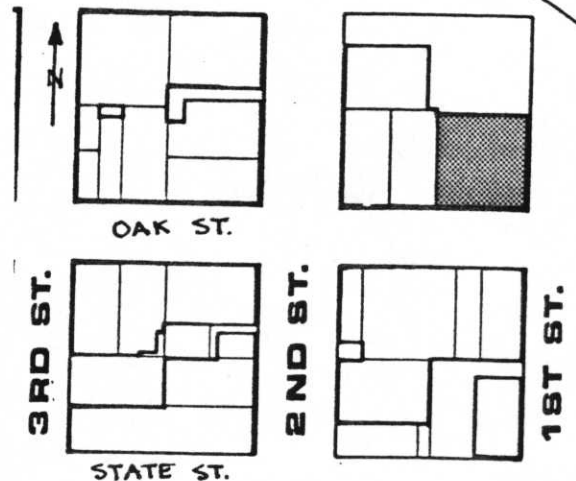
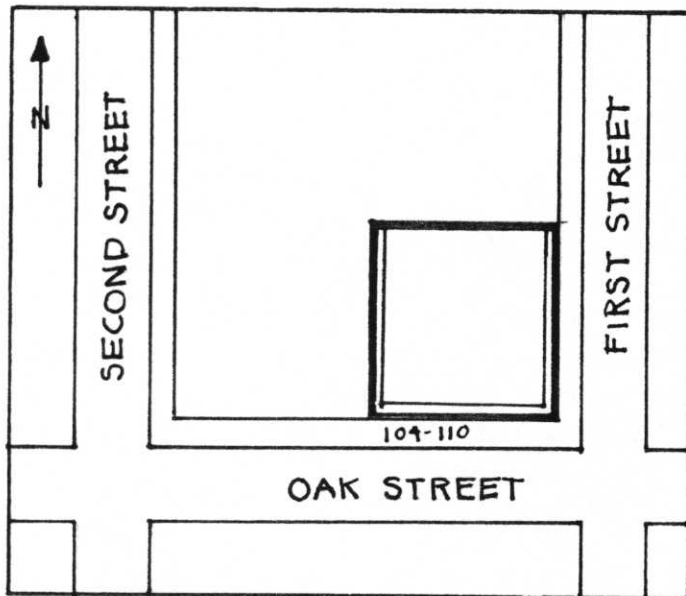
