STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Historical and/or architectural importance, dates, events, persons,

The site was previously occupied by an open air dance platform before the current building was constructed. The building was designed to include two stores. The western portion of the building was originally occupied by Kelly Brothers Hardware store and was subsequently occupied by Weber's Hardware, an appliance store, a shoe shop and a liquor store. The original tenant of the western portion of the building was a bakery, which occupied the store for more than fifty years. Subsequent businesses in the east section included a grocery store and an athletic store. The Rialto Theater, now razed, occupied the site directly to the west for many years.

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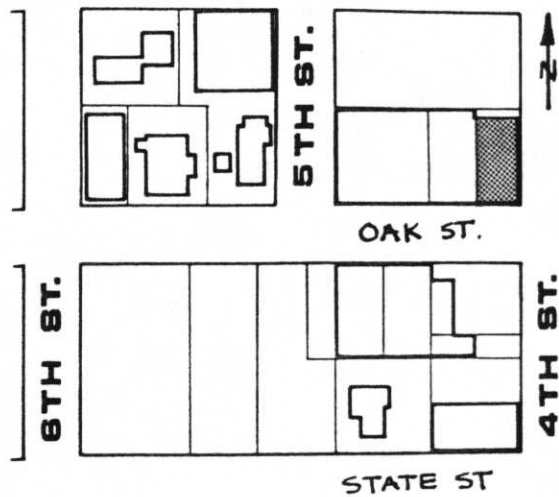
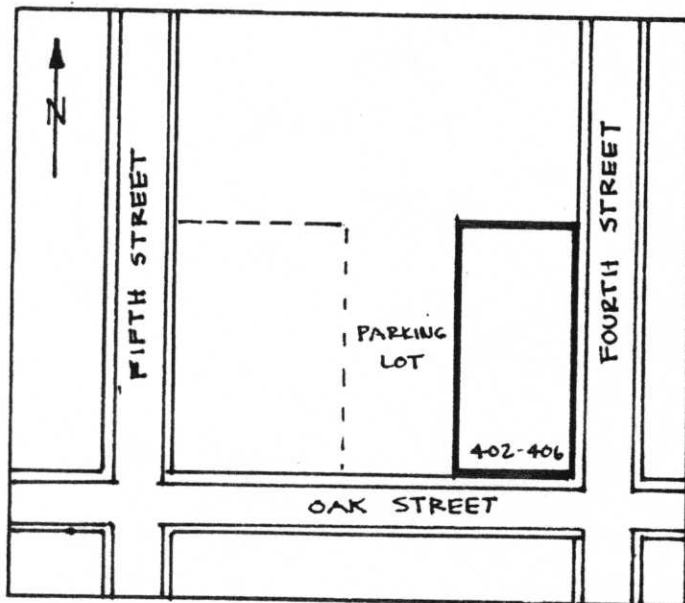
