Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

A one-and-a-half story dwelling with elevated entry porch. Arched panels between porch columns. Gable roof. Siding above porch is combination scallop and interlock diamond patterns. Traditional four-room floor plan.

The house was moved from the original site (Highway 99W) in August, 1978 to a temporary site (103rd & Canterbury Lanes) because it was located in the path of Highway 99W interchange expansion. The permanent site will be on Donation Land Claim on corner of SW Canterbury Lane and 103rd with the house facing East.

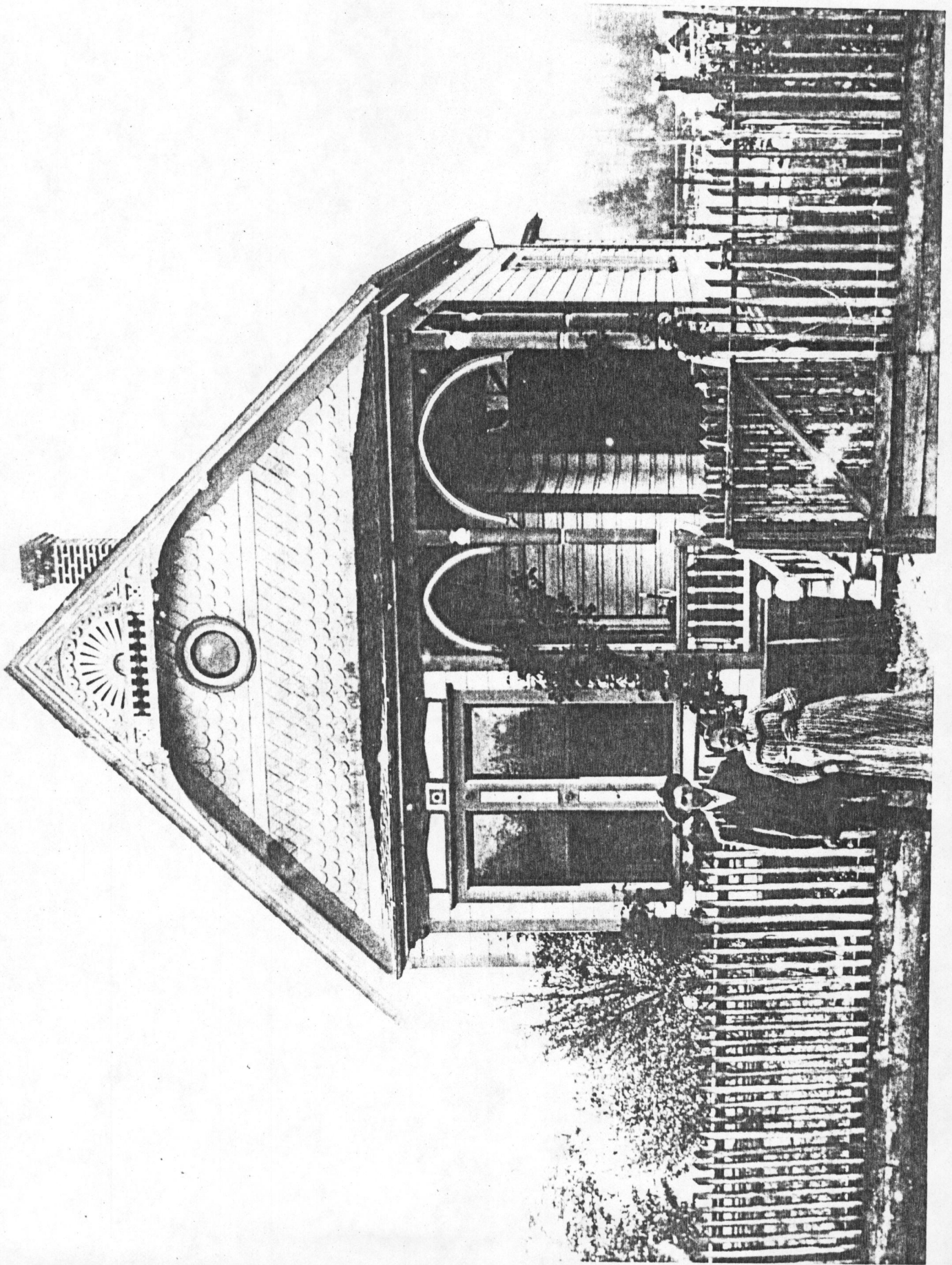
This was the home of John W. Tigard, son of founding father, Wilson M. Tigard. The Victorian architecture and "gingerbread" trim distinguished the house from the plainer homes in the neighborhood. It was built on Donation Land Claim dated Oct. 15, 1873, signed by President U. S. Grant.

The Tigard Area Historic and Preservation Association is planning now to involve public school children in study projects, service opportunities, public visitation, and future development of the house. Maps, sketches, photographs
