Landscape Architecture, Development: Laurelhurst Park was planned by the Olmsted Brothers of Brookline, Ma., the sons of Frederick Law Olmsted. With Peninsula Park, it is one of two parks which were realized as apart of the Olmsted's 1905 parks plan for the city. With its seemingly unplanned, "natural" landscaping, it is in the Olmsted tradition of landscape architecture, and in keeping with the "natural" landscaping of the adjacent Laurelhurst neighborhood, which was also based on an Olmsted plan.
