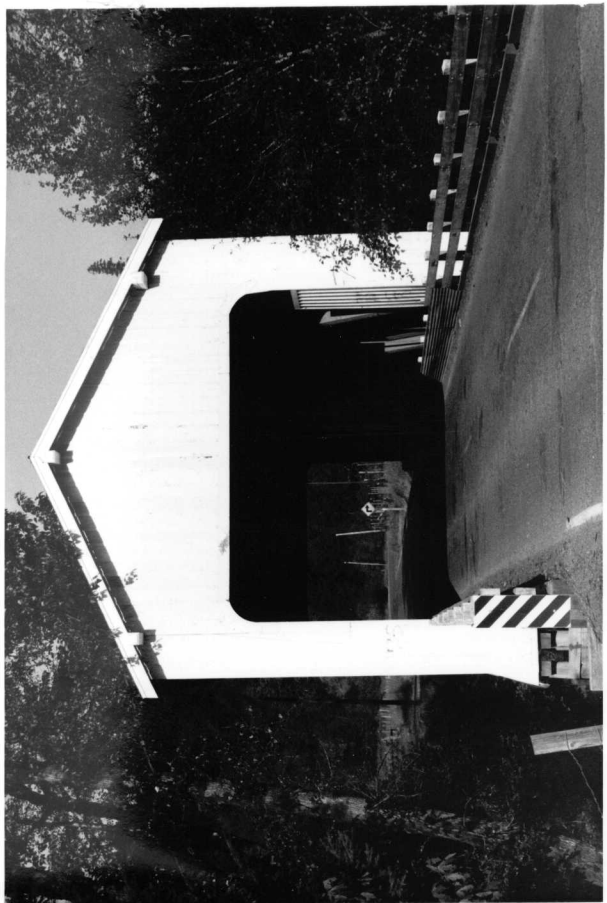

ent of historical significance:

The Brumbaugh Covered Bridge was erected in 1948 across Mosby Creek near Walden, Oregon. This bridge has a span of ninety feet and has a vertical board and batten exterior. This original exterior has been removed, however, on the north and south elevations (the sides) and has been replaced with corrugated sheet metal which also covers the gable roof. The bridge has a square portal and is set on wood piers. It has the following truss arrangement:

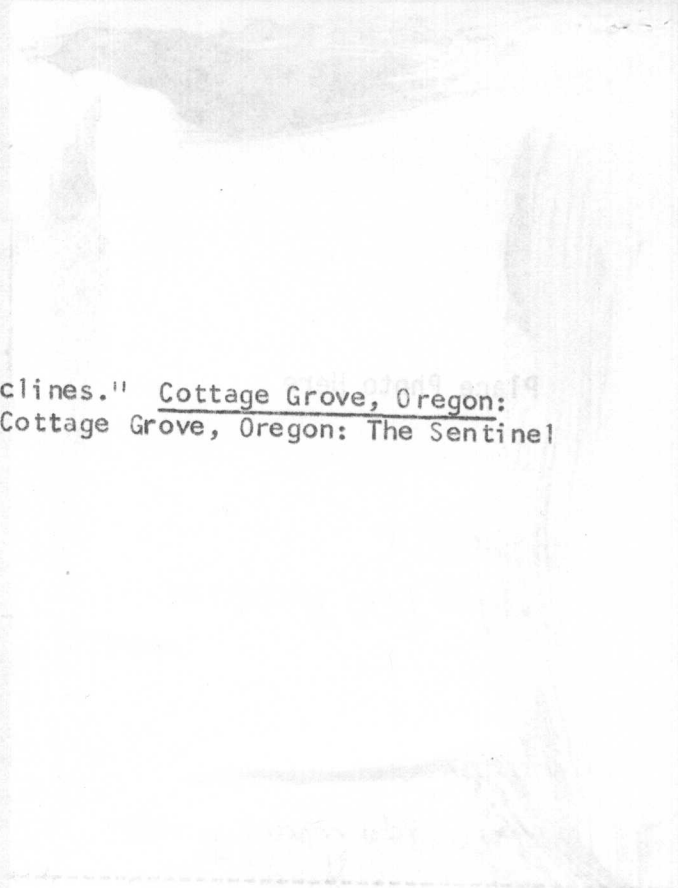

The Stoughton Covered Bridge was erected in 1857 across Mosby Creek near Seaside, Oregon. This bridge has a span of ninety feet and has a vertical board and batten extension. This original exterior has been removed, however, on the north and south elevations (the sides) and has been replaced with corrugated sheet metal which also covers the gate foot. The bridge has a square portal and is set on wood trestles. It has the following truss arrangement:
