Street River Park pier
KNOWN ARCHAEOLOGICAL FEATURES: large mounds of melted tin cans located
beneath the building remain from 1894 fire which destroyed original
cannery

SETTING: NW corner, 6th & Water; free standing; north side of
Burlington Northern tracks; built over river's edge

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: This building was built in 1894 to replace
the original cannery which burned to its pilings, In May, 1895, the
cannery was in operation again, rebuilt on its original supports.
Canning was discontinued around 1920 and the building served as a
central machine shop and warehouse for the Columbia River Packer's
Association until 1980. The building presently houses the offices for
Salmon For All, a fishing industry lobbying organization. The Kinney
Cannery building was placed on the National Register of Historical

Places in 1989.
