This structure was entered on the National Register on 3/8/78 G.W. Rhodes, architect. Brick masonry construction. Three stories. Italianate. Arcuated fenestration. Built by Cyrus A. Reed as Opera House and Hotel. It was during the late 19th Century the town's cultural center. The theatre closed in 1900, and the first and second stories were converted to mercantile use. In 1920 the large building was extensively rennovated for use as a department store. In recent years it was vacated by the Miller firm, and renovated for adaptive use as a shopping-restaurant complex. The Reed Opera House and its McCornack Block Addition of the turn-of-the-century were entered in the National Register as a unit 3/8/78. The main facade comprising seven bays fronts on Liberty Street. Missing from it is the pediment which rose from the roof line over the central bay. In the intervening years the space between brick posts spanned by wooden railings to make a parapet were filled in, and the tin or wood cornice supported by wooden brackets was removed. The exterior walls were stuccoed, and the ground story was remodeled to accommodate display windows. The Reed Opera House is one of the oldest and perhaps the largest of the buildings in the proposed district dating from the early period.
