Social: The Mann Home was established by The Old People's Home of Portland, Oregon, incorporated in 1908. This organization had formerly been the Old Ladies Home Society, founded in 1893 by Mrs. H.W. Corbett and a group of her friends. Purchase of the seven-acre site and construction of the building were made possible by funds provided by P.J. and Anna Lewis Mann. Prior to construction of its facility the Society had paid for room and board for elderly women at the Patton Home and in a private home.
