Conical roof on two-story turret. Pergola entry porch. Gabled roof and dormer. Shingle siding. Diamond pane windows. Stone chimney.

AREAS OF SIGNIFICANCE: Architecture, Visual Arts, Commerce in association with the Shogren sisters.

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Visual Arts, Commerce in association with the Shogren sisters. May and Anne Shogren were the modistes who dressed Portland's social leaders. The sisters, "Importers, Dressmakers and Ladies' Tailors," employed 80-100 seamstresses in their high fashion business, first located in the Dekum Building, and later at S.W. 10th and Yamhill. They were in business from the 1880's to World War I.
