*Education: Reed College was established as an educational institution of higher learning under a provision in the will of Simeon G. Reed's widow. Reed had expressed a desire that a portion of his estate be used for founding an educational institute and his wife bequeathed much of her estate for such a purpose. W.H. Ladd gave forty acres and combined with forty-six additional acres in the Eastmoreland Addition and the original endowment of \$3,000,000, created a school with heavy emphasis on the classical liberal arts curriculum free from "sectarian influences." The college has developed a national reputation based on high scholastic standards and produces a high proportion of students who go on to attain advanced degrees.*
