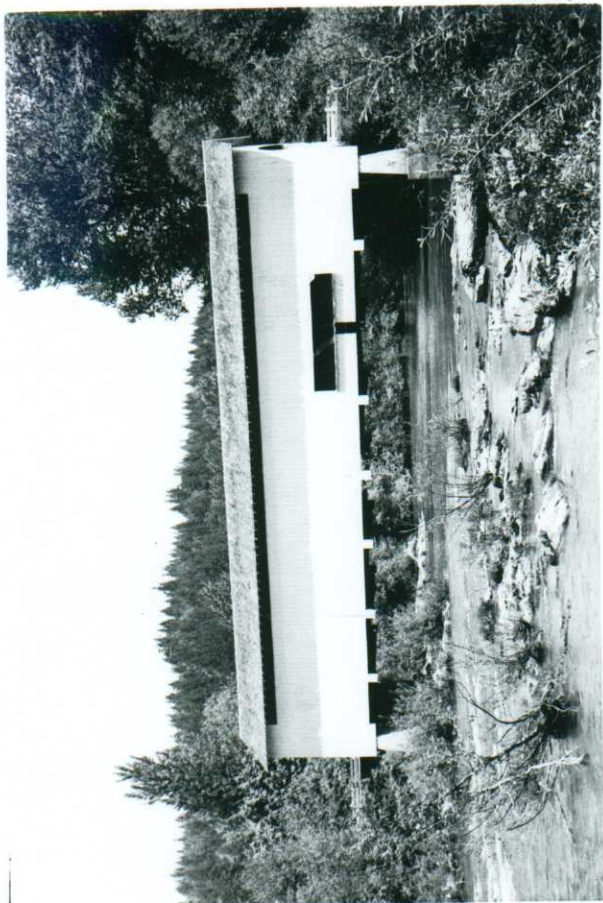

historical significance:

The Pengra Covered Bridge is a span of 120 feet which crosses Fall Creek about two miles southeast of Jasper, Oregon. The bridge has a vertical board and batten exterior and a gable roof. The eaves are open to provide lighting. There is a rectangular window on one elevation also for lighting. The gable roof is shingled.
