Physical

historical significance:

Faith Lutheran Church was constructed in 1906 by Mads Jensen, a Danish contractor and resident of Junction City, Oregon. The building is a simple, rectangular, wood frame structure with a gable roof and a bell tower over its main entrance. The square bell tower has a round window in its south side and louvered doors in the bellery. The building, which is in excellent condition, has a shingled gable roof, shiplap siding, and a concrete foundation. There are five window bays in the east and west elevations. The windows are in the Gothic Style.

This building, which is still used by the Lutherans, has been the center of much of the Scandinavian community in Junction City.

The building originally stood at 7th & Ivy but was resited in June, 1940.
